## Summary of key findings for parents

## The provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is free from hazards. He understands how to help keep children safe from potential hazards indoors and on outings.
- The childminder knows that he is responsible for the care and welfare of the children. He understands the procedures to follow if he has any concerns about a child being at risk of harm.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's good health through implementing daily cleaning routines to reduce the spread of germs, and providing regular exercise and nutritious foods essential for children's well-being.
- The childminder knows how to carry out observation and assessments of children's abilities. He knows how to use toys and plan activities to help children make progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour to promote their welfare and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to promote continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder has attended training courses to update his knowledge of childcare and uses a self-evaluation process to improve his practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
