The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She knows the correct procedures to follow to help keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to plan and promote children's learning. She provides a variety of activities to help support children's development in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents, and she uses a range of methods to engage with them. For example, she uses emails and text messaging.
- The childminder promotes inclusion well. For example, she obtains useful information about all children's individual needs to ensure they are known and met.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and the care and service she provides. This helps her identify priorities for improvement. She has addressed recommendations from her last inspection. She develops links with school staff to support older children's play and interests. She undertakes observations and assessments to plan activities children enjoy.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
