Summary of key findings for parents

This provision is good

- Children receive a warm welcome in this friendly pre-school. The good key-person system enhances relationships with children and their families very effectively. Children's individual development is respected and supported. All children make good progress in their learning and development.
- The quality of teaching is good. Staff provide an exciting and stimulating environment for children, which is well resourced and includes activities that reflect all areas of learning. This helps children to become motivated learners and to develop the skills they need ready for the school environment.
- Children settle well and enjoy their time at the pre-school. They feel safe, behave well and build strong attachments, which promotes their well-being and confidence.
- Partnerships with parents, schools and other professionals are good and have a positive impact on children's care, learning and development.
- The manager implements good arrangements for staff supervision and training, and promotes the sharing of information between staff. This supports staff in maintaining good practice throughout the setting and children make good progress in their learning and development.

It is not yet outstanding because:

- At times, staff do not recognise when to give children time to think and work out answers for themselves and provide the answers too quickly.
- Staff do not always use daily routines, such as snack time or getting ready to go outdoors, to promote children's indepedence skills.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

- offer more consistency in the encouragement for children to consider their own ideas and work things out before offering adult support
- make the most of opportunities to support children to take responsibility for manageable tasks to promote their independence more fully.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the children and parents, and held discussions with the manager and other staff.
- The inspector observed activities indoors and outdoors, including snack time.
- The inspector completed a joint observation with the manager.
- The inspector looked at assessment records, learning journeys and planning documentation.
- The inspector checked the suitability and qualifications of staff working with the children, the policies and procedures, and the self-evaluation form.

Inspection findings

Effectiveness of the leadership and management is good

The manager is well qualified and has a clear vision of how to improve the setting further. Recruitment and induction processes are robust and regular staff training ensures that all staff have a clear understanding of safeguarding procedures. Safeguarding is effective. The manager spends time in each area of the pre-school to review the types of activities offered and how children use the resources. Regular meetings with all staff ensure that the progress of different groups of children is monitored and that provision is adjusted to meet individual needs. There is very good communication between the staff and parents, who are very positive about the progress their children make. There are also positive developing relationships with other local settings, schools and relevant agencies. These help staff to coordinate the appropriate support for individual children.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Staff are well qualified and use their knowledge effectively to promote children's learning. They interact well with children and effectively observe and track their progress and learning needs. Staff plan time to work with their key children in small groups to target their individual next steps in learning. Staff demonstrate how to speak clearly. They also use toys and pictures to help children with speech and language difficulties and those learning English as an additional language develop their speaking skills. The most able children are well supported and encouraged through play to develop their writing and reading skills.

Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Children and families are warmly welcomed into this very friendly pre-school. Children attend well and are happy, secure and confident. They build good relationships with their key person, which effectively promotes their emotional well-being. Staff manage children's behaviour effectively. They reinforce good behaviour and celebrate successes in learning during activities. Children are generous to each other and share the bikes and toys well, for example, taking turns at driving each other around the track. Overall, staff support children to develop their self-care skills in readiness for school.

Outcomes for children are good

All children make good progress from their individual starting points and most are confident to ask questions and share ideas. Every opportunity is taken to encourage children to count, read and write during play. They independently explore books and eagerly take part in group singing, counting and reciting nursery rhymes.
