## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands child protection issues. She knows the signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare, and the procedures to follow to report these.
- The childminder knows how to identify children's starting points. She understands how to use observation and assessment of their learning in order to plan activities that will challenge and encourage their continual development and ongoing progress.
- The childminder knows how to prepare children for the next stages in their learning and their move on to school or nursery. She understands the importance of promoting their independence and personal care skills, to help them develop the skills they will need for their future learning.
- The childminder understands that children need to learn about the benefits of regular exercise and a healthy diet.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
