Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She is clear about safeguarding and child protection issues, and of her responsibility to provide children with a safe and secure environment.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's health and well-being. She holds a current first-aid qualification and public liability insurance.
- The childminder is aware of her role to work in partnership with parents and other early years providers to help her provide for children's care and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of planning activities that promote children's learning and development. She knows this includes monitoring children's achievements to help her support children to move onto the next stage in their learning.
- The childminder recognises her role in helping children build strong relationships. She understands that, by teaching the children to share, take turns and be kind to each other, this helps them learn to behave well.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing her childminding practice to help her improve her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
