The provision meets requirements

- The childminder updates her safeguarding knowledge, such as through training. She understands her role to implement procedures to safeguard and protect children within her care.
- The childminder continues to work with other professionals, such as the local childminding coordinator to obtain support, particularly on how to use the self-evaluation process to continuously reflect and improve her provision.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents to share crucial information about individual children's needs and interests.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and plan for children's learning and development. She has a range of inside and outdoor play resources and equipment, which are available for children.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour in a suitable way, particularly so that they learn to behave well and respect others.
- The childminder understands the importance of completing regular health and safety checks to ensure children play in a warm, safe and secure environment.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
