Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- Through discussion, the childminder shows her knowledge of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers involved in children's care, to promote continuity in children's experiences.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with interesting activities based on their individual needs to help them make progress in their learning.
- Using her good understanding of how to promote children's healthy lifestyles, the childminder has considered the benefits of providing healthy meals, promoting positive hygiene practices and ensuring children have daily fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of her role and responsibilities to safeguard and protect children. She has completed safeguarding training and is able to recognise the signs and symptoms that may be a cause for concern. She is aware of the action to take if she has worries about a child's welfare.
- Awareness of self-evaluation processes shows the childminder understands the importance of reflecting on her practice. She recognises the need to involve parents and children in this process, so she can action their feedback to help her improve her practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
