## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding and the correct procedures to follow if she should be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of monitoring and evaluating her provision to help identify and work towards improvements.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children how to learn to respect and value others. She understands how to manage children's behaviour in a consistent manner.
- The childminder understands how to use observations and assessment to plan for children's learning. She recognises the need to monitor whether children are progressing well regardless of their abilities, gender and backgrounds.
- There is an appropriate range of toys to support children's learning, which cover all areas of children's development. The childminder plans to make these accessible to children for them to make choices in their play.
- The childminder understands how to provide a safe and secure environment for children. She understands how to teach children about keeping safe. For example, through discussing road safety on the way to and from school.
- The childminder understands how to help children learn about healthy lifestyles and about good hygiene routines to promote their well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her practices and procedures, and how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that are available for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector looked at samples of documentation and records that the childminder plans to use to support children's welfare and learning when childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her systems for self-evaluation.
