Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She recognises the importance of working with parents to meet children's needs.
- The childminder knows the types of activities and play opportunities that she can offer to support all aspects of children's learning. She recognises how to monitor children's progress to help her plan for children's future learning.
- The childminder is fully aware of her role in helping to keep children safe and promoting their health. She is able to identify the procedures to follow in the event of a concern with a child's welfare. She encourages children to learn about good hygiene routines.
- The childminder understands the need to provide children with toys and equipment that suit their individual needs, ages and backgrounds. She understands the need to encourage children to make choices in their play.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour to help them learn to share and consider the needs of others. She understands her role in helping children to respect and value others.
- The childminder understands how to monitor her service and include the views of parents and children to help her improve children's experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her practices and procedures, and how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that will be used for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector looked at samples of documentation and records that the childminder will use to support children's welfare and learning when she is childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her systems for self-evaluation.
