# **Summary of key findings for parents**

#### This provision requires improvement. It is not yet good because:

- Assessment procedures are not accurate or recorded precisely to identify any gaps in children's learning.
- The provider does not have a named deputy to take charge in the manager's absence, as required.
- Communication with other providers is not fully successful to enable professionals to share children's progress effectively.

#### It has the following strengths

- Children have access to regular exercise through daily walks around the community. They enjoy healthy snacks and staff encourage them to follow good hygiene routines.
- Children are happy. They have positive relationships with staff and their personal, social and emotional development is good.
- Staff provide a wide range of activities that keep children motivated. They learn to play cooperatively, share and take turns with each other.
- Partnerships with parents are positive. Staff share information frequently to enable parents to support children's learning at home.
- Children have good levels of self-esteem and confidence and are independent in their learning.

# **Inspection findings**

## Effectiveness of the leadership and management requires improvement

The provider implements systems to ensure the smooth running of the provision. However, there is no named deputy to take charge in the manager's absence, as required. Safeguarding is effective. Safe and robust recruitment procedures help to ensure staff's suitability. They regularly attend child protection training. They understand policies and procedures to protect children from harm so that they stay safe. Staff work effectively together by sharing ideas and receive regular support from the manager to help develop their practice. The provider and staff use their self-evaluation process to identify some areas for improvement. Although partnerships with some professionals help staff support children, liaison with other settings children attend is not fully established.

## Quality of teaching, learning and assessment requires improvement

Staff follow children's interests and use these in the planning process to ensure children are interested. For example, children enjoy making spiders using paint and lolly sticks. However, staff do not always use their skills and qualifications effectively to ensure assessments are accurate. Staff do not use assessments effectively to enable children to make the progress they should and identify any emerging gaps in their development. Children thoroughly enjoy their daily walks and staff teach them about the community and their environment. For example, staff help children to think about weather as they watch rain water running down the road, and talk about what they see in local shop windows. This helps children develop their language skills and contributes to their awareness of the world around them. Children are beginning to learn letter sounds through activities such as listening to familiar stories where staff use props to support their understanding of sounds.

#### Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Children display good levels of confidence and independently choose their own resources. Staff use positive strategies to help children feel emotionally prepared for school, such as settling sessions. Children behave well. They learn to stay safe. For example, they understand the need to wear fluorescent jackets on outings. Staff encourage children to hold hands whilst crossing the road and talk to children about road safety. Staff actively promote children's understanding of friendships, tolerance and respect, both in practice and through visual displays. Children have secure attachments to staff which promotes their well-being.

#### **Outcomes for children require improvement**

Children enjoy their time at pre-school. Those with additional needs receive support from outside agencies. Children make steady progress in their learning. However, weaknesses in assessment mean that potential gaps in development are not closing as quickly as possible.
