## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and how to promote children's well-being, learning and development.
- The childminder has completed child protection training and is confident to follow the local safeguarding procedures if she has any concerns about a child.
- The childminder understands how to assess children's progress. She provides appropriate teaching methods, resources and activities to support their learning and development needs.
- The childminder supports children's well-being and opportunities for shared learning by establishing positive relationships with parents and other early years providers. This helps children as they move between settings and on to school.
- The childminder encourages children to enjoy outdoor physical play, develop healthy eating habits and follow effective hygiene procedures to promote their good health.
- The childminder monitors and evaluates her practice regularly and completes relevant training, in order to drive continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will meet children's individual learning and development needs, and how she will observe, assess and track children's progress.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the arrangements for safeguarding children.
- The inspector viewed the premises, toys and equipment.
