## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to use observations of children to assess their stages of development and plan suitably challenging activities to help children make progress in their learning. She has a wide range of resources to promote all areas of learning.
- The childminder has a good knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues. She knows how to report any concerns to the appropriate agency.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. For example, she understands the need to provide daily outdoor play and exercise for children.
- The childminder knows how to include the views of parents and children in her selfevaluation and how she will use the information as part of her improvement plan.
- The childminder understands the importance of building strong relationships with children to support their emotional well-being and confidence.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to respect the diversity of the world and develop their social skills including sharing and turn taking.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to meet legal requirements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
