Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding about how to keep children safe. She ensures her home is safe from potential hazards. She knows her duties relating to child protection.
- The childminder knows the importance of reviewing her practice. She attends training to ensure she keeps up-to-date and identifies her strengths and areas for development.
- The childminder knows how to work with parents and other professionals to ensure children's outcomes. She understands how to take their feedback and use it to improve her practice further. She knows how to keep them informed of their children's progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical development and well-being. She knows the importance of incorporating daily fresh air and exercise into her plans.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She knows how to plan activities which meet the needs of all children, across all areas of learning. She understands the importance of carefully tracking children's progress.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's social and communication skills, and early literacy and mathematics, to prepare them well for the move to school or nursery.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured the premises with the childminder to look at the areas used by children.
- The inspector asked the childminder questions to assess her understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector sampled the childminder's policies and procedures and checked documentation relating to safeguarding.
