- The childminder understands how children learn and how to promote their development. She has suitable systems to help her evaluate children's progress and plan activities that support the next stage of their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She recognises the need to share information about children's progress and development.
- The childminder understands safeguarding issues and how to keep children safe. She has an up-to-date and detailed safeguarding policy. She knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns for a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her practice and develop her skills. She researches good practice and is well informed about changes that affect her childminding provision.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting a healthy lifestyle; for example, providing regular outdoor play and encouraging healthy eating.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
