### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to assess and monitor development. She knows how to plan a range of interesting and exciting activities for children to help them make progress across all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of building partnerships with parents and where there is shared care with other providers. She knows sharing information helps to ensure that she consistently plans for children's learning and improves their outcomes.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting good manners, kindness and respect for others. She knows teaching children right from wrong supports their good behaviour and helps their feelings of well-being. It is also important in preparing children for school.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She understands her responsibilities to be alert to issues which impact on children's safety and feelings of well-being. She maintains the suitability of those who regularly come into contact with them.
- The childminder is knowledgeable about why self-evaluation is central to developing and improving her service. She understands the importance of collecting the views of parents and others to help in this process.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
