## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She has recently updated her safeguarding training and understands her role with regard to child protection.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's progress in order to plan activities that help them move on in their learning and prepare them for school. She understands the need to involve parents in children's learning.
- The childminder has a suitable range of resources. She knows how to use the resources to support children's learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to value and respect others.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being, for example, by providing healthy meals and daily exercise.
- The childminder knows how to reflect on her practice and identify areas for development to improve children's experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector checked the areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector saw examples of documentation the childminder uses.
- The inspector discussed childcare practices with the childminder.
