## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps up to date with current childcare issues to maintain her knowledge and understanding. For example, she has recently completed a relevant level 4 childcare qualification, attends training and reads childcare publications.
- The childminder is aware of how to keep children safe. She has completed child protection training and understands the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to plan challenging activities and play experiences to promote children's development and help prepare them for their future learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to value and respect others. She has a range of strategies to support children's awareness of good behaviour and to help them learn about the wider world.
- The childminder understands the benefits of working closely with parents and any professionals involved in children's lives in order to provide continuity of care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
