## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to safeguard children, including her responsibility to keep them safe. She understands how to promote children's awareness of diversity and tolerance towards others
- The childminder understands how to deliver the learning and development requirements. She reflects on her practice and identifies ways to improve, in order to achieve better outcomes for children.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles for children. She knows how to encourage children to be independent, such as in their personal care routines and meet their dietary needs.
- The childminder knows how to provide an environment that supports children's self-esteem and confidence, and which promotes positive behaviour.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning, and plan for their next steps. She recognises the importance of working with parents to support children's learning.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of updating her professional knowledge, such as through further training, to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector checked resources and areas of the childminder's home available for children.
- The inspector discussed the policies and documents the childminder intends to use when caring for children, including the arrangements for meeting the safeguarding requirements, and ways of working with parents.
- The inspector sampled documentation that the childminder intends to use when monitoring children's development, including her assessment and planning processes.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to gain an understanding of her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she plans to develop her role through self-evaluation.
