Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements because she does not hold a current, suitable first-aid certificate. The associated requirements of the Childcare Register are not met.
- The childminder understands the importance of carrying out risk assessments to minimise any hazards and keep children safe. She understands the need to protect children from harm and to report any concerns about their welfare.
- The childminder knows the need to meet the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan activities and experiences to support children's individual learning and development needs, whatever their backgrounds, and to help prepare them for school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of managing children's behaviour in a positive way, and of teaching them to respect others. She knows the need to liaise with parents to be able to meet children's physical needs.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate and improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
