## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder meets the requirements and keeps up to date with these. She knows how to provide a varied range of learning experiences for children to meet their individual developmental needs whatever their backgrounds, abilities and ages.
- The childminder knows the need to carry out assessments on children at the age of two years and to monitor their progress. She is aware of how to plan for children's progress to help them be ready for school.
- The childminder knows the importance of establishing partnerships with parents to be able to know and meet children's physical needs.
- The childminder understands the need to keep children safe and to protect them from harm. She knows how to identify any possible signs that a child's welfare is at risk. She understands the need to follow appropriate safeguarding procedures.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's personal development and their understanding of the wider world. She knows the importance of teaching children to behave well and to respect others' differences and similarities.
- The childminder knows the importance of furthering her professional development and completing further training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at areas of the house used for childminding.
