Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She knows what procedures to follow should she have a concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate. She knows what to do in a medical emergency.
- The childminder understands how to implement her policies and procedures, and review her risk assessments to support children's safety, health and well-being.
- The childminder has an appropriate understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows the importance of planning activities and providing experiences, inside and outdoors, to meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing good quality, and suitable toys and resources to promote children's learning, in line with their interests and needs.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating the quality of her provision. She understands the importance of maintaining and updating her skills and knowledge. The childminder has updated her knowledge of new legislation. She knows how to promote equality and diversity.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed the childminder's home and resources.
- The inspector sampled the childminder's documentation.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. They discussed how the childminder updates her skills and knowledge.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She spoke with the childminder about how she plans for children's individual needs.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she evaluates the quality of her provision.
