Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to help children prepare for starting school. She knows the importance of encouraging children to do things for themselves.
- The childminder knows how to offer children challenging experiences based on their individual interests to help them make progress in learning.
- The childminder has written policies to underpin her practice, including safeguarding. She understands the signs to be aware of and the procedures to follow to keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being. She understands the importance of teaching children about healthy eating and providing them with regular fresh air and exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
