Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider has taken sufficient action to address weaknesses identified at the last inspection. The provider demonstrates through discussion and documents that they assess staff's suitability for their role. The provider states that they follow the club's recruitment, vetting, induction and training procedures.
- The provider demonstrates through discussion and storage of information that they understand the importance of data protection issues and maintaining confidentiality.
- The provider holds public liability insurance and expects all staff to complete first aid and safeguarding training. Staff demonstrate they are able to identify adult behaviours, signs of abuse and neglect that cause concern. They discuss the procedures to follow for dealing with any safeguarding and child protection issues.
- The provider explains how staff contribute to self-evaluation procedures and action planning to improve the service. They use questionnaires to seek feedback from parents and children.
- Staff show through the organisation of resources that they understand the importance of offering children choice. Staff discuss how they observe children. They explain that they have regard to the areas of learning, children's abilities, interests and learning in school when planning play experiences.
- Staff demonstrate that they understand the importance of promoting children's good health and independence. They discuss how they make use of the school grounds to encourage physical activity. They know the importance of providing healthy snacks and promoting effective hygiene routines.
- Staff explain how they settle new children by spending time building up relationships with them. They discuss how they share information with parents and school so that they get to know children.
- Staff demonstrate through their discussions and written policies that they understand how to positively promote children's good behaviour and their awareness of safe practices. Staff explain how they use praise, implement simple rules and boundaries and talk to children about their own safety and risks.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed areas of the club to be used by the children.
- The inspector and staff discussed and looked at toys, books, resources and equipment that are available to children.
- The inspector discussed with staff the planning arrangements in place to support younger children's learning and progress.
- The inspector held a meeting with the manager and provider. She looked at relevant documentation, such as policies, procedures and self-evaluation. She looked at evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.

Chantreyland Out-of-school Norton Free was registered in 2006 and is managed by Chantreyland Childrens Nursery Partnership. The club operates from Norton Free Primary School in the Norton area of Sheffield. The club employs two members of childcare staff. Of these, the manager holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 3. The club opens Monday to Friday, term time only and sessions are from 3.20pm until 6pm. The club serves children who attend Norton Free Primary School and the club have close links with the school.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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
