# Summary of key findings for parents

## The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the procedures to follow in order to safeguard children should she have concerns about a child in her care. The childminder's home is free from hazards. She knows how to carry out risk assessments to minimise potential hazards to children.
- The childminder understands how to implement the learning and development requirements and has a relevant childcare qualification. She knows how to use observation and assessment to plan for individual children's needs.
- The childminder provides children with experiences to promote their physical wellbeing. She understands the importance of providing nutritious food for the children in her care.
- The childminder recognises the benefit of working in partnership with parents and external agencies to provide continuity of care and learning for children.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour well and develop their awareness of diversity.
- The childminder evaluates her practice, taking into account the views of parents. She has attended training courses to keep up to date with childcare practices and relevant legislation.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's house and garden that she plans to use for the care of children.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her self-evaluation and improvement plan.
- The inspector looked at relevant documents and discussed the policies and documents the childminder intends to use when caring for children, including arrangements for meeting safeguarding requirements and ways of working with parents.
