## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands and meets the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She has documentation in place to manage her setting.
- The childminder has policies and procedures for keeping children safe, including a risk assessment, and knows how and where to refer any concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning and how to help children to develop. She knows the need to work with parents to assess and monitor their children's progress, to identify any gaps in their learning and to meet their needs.
- The childminder has resources to support children of different ages, abilities and backgrounds. She understands the need to enable children to have daily access to fresh air and exercise to promote their good health. She understands the need to promote children's good behaviour and to help them to respect others.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of teaching children to become independent and to help them to be well prepared for school. She recognises the need to have links with other professionals.
- The childminder plans for the development of her setting and practice through evaluation and further training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the childminder's premises, indoors and outdoors, and the facilities available.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder through the inspection.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and promote children's learning.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including the suitability checks of adults living on the premises, and a range of paperwork relating to risk assessment accident and attendance records, and policies.
