## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide a suitable range of resources and activities for children of all ages. This helps children prepare for the next stage in their learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to keep children safe. She recognises signs that would cause concerns about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow.
- The childminder is experienced and completes relevant training to improve her knowledge of best practice and to support children's outcomes.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. This helps encourage continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to use observation and assessments to plan for children's individual needs and interests. She is fully aware of the need to obtain advice and support to meet children's specific needs if necessary.
- The childminder recognises the need to provide an inclusive environment so children learn to accept and value each other's similarities and differences.
- Children would have nutritious meals and snacks to promote a healthy lifestyle.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector checked the suitability of all members of the household.
- The inspector viewed a range of documents, such as policies, certificates, planning and assessments systems.
