Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to support and extend children's learning through their play and activities. She understands how to plan, observe and monitor children's progress to help her prepare them for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour to help them learn to share, take turns and be respectful of each other.
- The childminder understands her role in helping to keep children safe and keeps her knowledge up to date. She is able to recognise possible signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child is at risk of harm and knows what to do if she has any child protection concerns.
- The childminder reviews her risk assessments procedures to help her identify and reduce any potential hazards to children's safety.
- The childminder understands the need to provide children with toys and experiences that suit their individual needs and interests.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting and improving on her practice, and that of her assistant. She uses her self-evaluation process to help identify where they can both increase their skills and knowledge, and to help drive improvements to the provision and outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her practices and procedures, and how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that will be used for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector looked at samples of documentation and records that the childminder will use to support children's welfare and learning when she is childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her systems for self-evaluation.
