- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's learning and to meet their physical needs.
- The childminder knows the need to observe and assess children's development. She understands the importance of checking children's progress and of preparing them for school, whatever their different individual learning needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of being a positive role model to children and of promoting their positive behaviour. She understands the importance of teaching children to respect others and to develop their knowledge of the wider world.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's personal independence, and of teaching them the importance of a healthy lifestyle. She knows how to promote children's good health and the need to provide daily outdoor activities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
