## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements and how to implement these in her practice to promote suitable outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows how working in partnerships with parents and others helps promote consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder is aware of the need to promote healthy lifestyles. For example, she would provide children with fruit and vegetables.
- The childminder understands how to use observations, assessments and planning to support children's progress in their learning.
- The childminder provides a safe learning environment. She has safeguarding procedures to follow that promote children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder knows how to manage her professional development. She understands the benefits of regular training to keep her knowledge and skills up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework and her role.
- The inspector observed the areas in the home used for childminding.
- The inspector sampled some of the childminder's documentation, including training and suitability records.

The childminder registered in 1999. She lives in Tottenham, in the London Borough of Haringey. She lives on the second floor and the home may be accessed via a lift. The childminder operates Monday to Friday, from 8am to 6pm, throughout most year. There were no children on roll at the time of this inspection.
