## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain a valid first-aid certificate, as required. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder knows how to plan stimulating activities to promote children's learning and to monitor their progress. She understands how to adapt activities to meet all children's needs and suitably prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being, encourage positive behaviour and teach children to respect and value each other.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The childminder understands the importance of establishing partnerships with parents to provide consistent care and learning for children.
- The childminder has a suitable capacity to improve. She has completed the recommendations from her previous inspection to improve the learning and safety for children. She understands the role of self-evaluation and intends to attend training courses to develop her knowledge further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
