Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain a valid paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder has failed to maintain a policy of public liability insurance.
- The childminder has a poor knowledge of child protection issues. She lacks understanding of the procedures to follow should concerns arise about a child. She does not know who to contact should she be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder does not have an up-to-date knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She does not understand how to promote children's progress across all areas of learning and support them in their readiness for school.
- The childminder has limited understanding of how to observe and assess children's development. She does not plan for children's next steps in learning. She lacks knowledge and understanding of the requirement for carrying out a progress check for children between the ages of two and three years.
- The childminder demonstrates that she has a reasonable understanding of how to promote children's good health. She understands the importance of providing children with exercise and rest, effective personal-hygiene routines and healthy eating.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of working in partnership with parents. She talks about the reasons for sharing information about children's learning and care
- The childminder's home is warm and welcoming. Suitable risk assessments cover all areas that children use.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further
