Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not provided Ofsted with all the information needed to complete the required suitability checks for all members of the household over the age of 16. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder is aware of his duty to safeguard children. He understands the possible signs that may concern him about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow.
- The childminder is committed to providing good quality childcare. He regularly attends further training and support groups to keep up to date on new legislation.
- The childminder knows the importance of working closely with parents, sharing information about their children's care and learning, to support their development and well-being.
- The childminder demonstrates a good awareness of the learning and development requirements. He knows to plan activities based around children's interests, complete observations and monitor children's progress.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder was registered in 1999. He is based in Hayes, in the London borough of Hillingdon. The childminder has an early years childcare qualification at level 3. He offers care term time only. There were no children in the early years age group on roll when this inspection took place.
