# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She attends training to keep her knowledge and skills updated.
- The childminder's home is welcoming for children. She has organised a range of high-quality toys and resources to help her ensure that children progress well in all areas.
- The childminder understands the importance of sharing information with parents, so that children benefit from a united approach to their learning and development.
- The childminder demonstrates she knows how to promote children's well-being. She understands how to help children behave well and respect each other.
- The childminder and her assistant keep up to date with safeguarding practices. They know how to identify concerns about children's welfare and who to contact should this be necessary. They know how to spot and minimise hazards in the house and garden.
- The childminder understands how to track children's development, to check how they are progressing. She knows how to evaluate her provision and seek the views of parents and children, so that she can maintain continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
