## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her knowledge of safeguarding and child protection up to date. She knows what to do, and who to contact, in the event of a concern. She assesses and minimises risks in her home and on outings.
- The childminder uses information from training, research and other professionals to help her evaluate her practice, and identify her strengths and any areas for improvement.
- The childminder understands how children learn through play. She plans activities covering all areas of learning and understands the benefits of outdoor play for children.
- The childminder holds a certificate in paediatric first aid and has clear policies and procedures to support children's well-being. She has a secure understanding of how to promote healthy lifestyles and positive, confident behaviour in children.
- The childminder understands the importance of effective partnerships with parents and other settings in supporting continuity in children's learning. She understands the need to plan activities to prepare children well for their moves to other settings and school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled the childminder's documentation, including policies, suitability checks and training certificates.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's knowledge of safeguarding and child protection procedures.
- The inspector viewed the premises with the childminder.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder plans to implement the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents and carers from information provided in parents' letters.
