## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to encourage children's development and understands the importance of planning a range of activities to meet children's different needs.
- The childminder understands how to monitor children's progress to help her plan and prepare children for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder knows how to help keep children safe. She is aware of the signs that may cause concerns about children's welfare and is clear on the procedures to follow.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continuous improvement and increasing her skills, knowledge and training to help improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour. She understands her role in helping children to respect others and to value diversity in the wider world.
- The childminder understands the importance of building relationships with parents and professionals at other settings that children attend, in order to know and meet children's learning and care needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how her knowledge of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector looked at a sample of policies, procedures and paperwork.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector looked at the spaces, equipment and toys available for children's use and discussed how the childminder plans to maintain a safe environment for children.
