Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain her first-aid certificate, to ensure she has up-todate knowledge of how to manage accidents in the setting. However, she has taken steps to re-book the training. She demonstrates a suitable understanding of all of the other safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The childminder clearly explains her understanding of the learning and development requirements. She describes how she will use observation to identify what children already know. She will involve parents and carers to ensure she has detailed information to plan children's next steps in learning with ongoing assessments.
- The childminder describes a suitable range of activities to promote children's learning. She explains how she will encourage children's contributions when planning, to take into account their interests. The childminder offers an appropriate range of toys and resources that are stored at low-level for children.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of how to ensure children's safety. She describes how she will carefully supervise children on outings, and explains that she will check the premises before children arrive each day.
- The childminder has a sound awareness of how to safeguard children. She gives relevant examples of signs or indicators of abuse or neglect. She is clear on the procedure she will follow if she has any concerns about a child in her care.
- The childminder demonstrates a sound understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. She will encourage children to work together as a team and look after each other. Parents and carers of the older children highlight this as one of the strengths of the childminder.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands the importance of regular communication with parents, carers and other settings to promote children's needs. She describes how she will support children as they move onto school, so that she can prepare them emotionally.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
