Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is safe and secure. She knows how to carry out safety checks to reduce hazards to children, inside and outside of the home.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of child protection issues and knows how to proceed if a child is at risk of harm. She has an appropriate understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements, and knows how to promote children's health and well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers, to promote continuity of care and learning for children.
- The childminder knows how to use a range of strategies to manage children's behaviour and develop their awareness of diversity.
- The childminder understands how to use observations and assessments to help plan for children's learning and development. She knows how to provide play experiences to help children progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder has addressed the recommendation set at the last inspection. In addition, she has attended training courses to develop her skills and evaluates her practice to develop her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her childcare practices, including how she plans to promote children's learning and development, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector went on a tour of the premises with the childminder.
- The inspector viewed the furniture, toys and equipment for children.

The childminder registered in 1989. She lives in Edmonton Green within the London Borough of Enfield. The childminder operates on a part time basis, all-year round. There were no children present at the time of the inspection.
