## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to provide children with learning experiences to meet their different needs and abilities.
- The childminder is aware of her role and responsibility to keep children safe. She understands how to identify and report any concerns relating to a child's health and welfare.
- The childminder is aware of the need to complete training and evaluate her service to increase her knowledge. She has completed recent safeguarding training.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's understanding of diversity and their personal development. She understands how to teach children to have respect for others from different backgrounds and how to behave.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing relationships with parents and other professionals to share information and promote continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's abilities when they start with her and use this information to help prepare them for school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the requirements for the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector looked at areas of the childminder's house intended for the use of children.
