## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role and responsibilities to keep children safe. She knows how to report any concerns about a child in her care and completes risk assessments to minimise any hazards to children.
- The childminder knows how to track children's progress and understands how to use assessments to plan interesting activities that challenge children's learning.
- The childminder understands the need to share information with parents regularly to help promote a consistent approach to supporting children's learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting on her provision. She uses this to identify any training needs to help her improve her skills and practice.
- The childminder has a wide range of resources that reflect a diverse society. She recognises the importance of praising children's achievements to help them learn to behave well and to respect others.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and well-being, such as ensuring they eat nutritious food and enjoy fresh air outside.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
