Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role to safeguard and protect children from harm. She is aware of child protection issues and knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child's well-being.
- The childminder recognises the importance to continuously reflect and evaluate on her provision, in order to identify new ways to improve children's outcomes. She knows how to work closely with parents and to obtain their valuable feedback.
- The childminder understands how to observe, plan and assess children's learning and development. She knows how to provide stimulating activities and resources to help children progress well.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote positive behaviour, helping children to learn right from wrong, and listening and showing respect to others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that promote children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents, which she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and toured the areas of the childminder's home that she intends to use for children.

The childminder registered in 1993. She lives in Walthamstow, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest. The childminder operates weekdays, during term time only. She holds a relevant early years qualification at level 2. There were no children on roll at the time of this inspection.
