The childminder registered in 2004 and lives in Eastleigh, near Southampton. She offers childcare during school holidays and for three weekdays during term time. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection. The childminder is accredited to receive funding to provide free early years education for children aged two, three and four years. She holds a level 3 childcare qualification.
