Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder is not aware of all her safeguarding responsibilities, including relevant legislation, to keep children safe. This breach also relates to the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not hold a valid paediatric first-aid certificate or relevant public liability insurance, as required. These breaches also relate to the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not understand the requirement to undertake written progress checks for children aged between two and three years and shares with parents, to monitor children's progress.
- The childminder knows how to provide age-appropriate activities and resources to extend children's interests and promote their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's physical health and well-being, such as through healthy eating and developing their independence skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
