## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder understands most of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. However, she does not know how to use information from her observations and assessments of children to identify their learning needs and help them make further progress.
- The childminder is aware of the procedures to follow in order to safeguard children and promote their safety and well-being.
- The childminder understands about the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to ensure consistency in meeting children's needs.
- The childminder keeps update with most childcare practices. For example, she attends relevant workshops and liaises with her local authority development team to access further training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:**

- develop knowledge and understanding of how to use information gained from assessing children's learning, to monitor their ongoing progress and identify the next steps in their learning. 23/03/2016

- The inspector talked to the childminder about her practice and assessed her knowledge of the statutory requirements.
- The inspector viewed the areas in the home used for childminding to ensure they are suitable.
- The inspector sampled a range of the childminder's documentation, including children's learning profiles and the childminder's policies and procedures.
