# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is familiar with child protection issues and she understands the procedures to follow should she have concern about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate the provision. She knows how to maintain her professional development to improve her skills and children's outcomes.
- The childminder knows how to form close relationship with children and their families to support children's emotional well-being. She knows how to share information and gain parental involvement to promote children's care and learning.
- The childminder has knowledge of child development. She understands how to observe, plan and assess children's learning. She knows how to provide appropriate indoor and outdoor learning experiences to support children's progression.
- The childminder knows how to promote positive attitudes and good behaviour, in order for children to learn right from wrong.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
