## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice and identifying areas for improvement. She recognises the need to keep her training and knowledge up to date to help her to continually improve her provision and the outcomes for children.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to promote children's safety and well-being and to protect them from harm. She knows the procedures to follow should she need to make a child protection referral.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of knowing a child's starting points. She understands the relevance of observing, planning and assessing children's learning to help them make progress and become ready for starting nursery or school.
- The childminder understands how to work closely with parents and professionals, to help promote children's learning and care needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to value diversity and difference.
- The childminder is aware of how to help children to understand healthy choices to promote their well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector checked the childminder's records of suitability to work with children, training and paediatric first-aid certificates.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder regarding her knowledge of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's safeguarding and welfare policies and procedures.
- The inspector looked at the premises and resources available for childminding.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's self-evaluation processes.
