Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a sufficient understanding of how to identify the possible signs and symptoms which may indicate that a child is at risk of harm. Furthermore, she does not know the procedures for reporting such concerns locally, to help safeguard children. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not hold public liability insurance. This is also a breach of the associated requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not understand how to identify where she does not meet requirements.
- The childminder understands the need to work with parents to meet children's individual physical and learning needs, and to help to prepare children for school.
- The childminder understands how to provide a range of resources to meet the individual needs of children and to promote their progress, whatever their backgrounds, ages and abilities.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and the need to provide a clean environment for children's play. She understands the need to provide children with daily outdoor activities.
- The childminder knows the need to promote children's personal, social and emotional development, including their ability to understand those who differ from themselves.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
