Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to keep her paediatric first-aid certificate up to date, which compromises children's safety. This breach also relates to the Childcare Register.
- The childminder knows how to identify and report any signs that may indicate a child's welfare may be at risk of harm. She knows how to risk assess her premises, so that children play in safety.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of establishing relationships with parents to meet the children's individual care and learning needs. She knows how to observe and assess children's progress, and the need to share this information with their parents as part of helping to prepare children for school.
- The childminder understands how to teach children about good behaviour and the consequences of their behaviour on others. She is aware of how to support children's personal development, and teach them about the wider world and people who are different from themselves.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her service to seek to improve it through further professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
