- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's independence and confidence. She knows how to encourage children to be motivated and eager to learn.
- The childminder provides a safe and welcoming environment for children. She understands how to risk assess her home and knows what to do if she has concerns about a child's welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. The childminder registered in 2008. She lives in Croydon, Surrey. She operates all day from Monday to Friday and for the majority of the year, except for family holidays. The childminder holds a childcare qualification at level 3. She receives funding to provide free early education for children aged two, three and four years. There were no children present at the time of this inspection.
