Summary of key findings for parents

This provision is good

- Children enjoy their time at the club and are very happy and relaxed. They choose from a varied range of activities and experiences on offer to them in the club.
- The friendly and enthusiastic interactions between staff and children help them form secure attachments quickly. Children demonstrate they feel safe and confident in the care of staff.
- Children's behaviour is good as staff are effective role models. They are deployed well and provide clear guidance for children about what is acceptable behaviour.
- Children play well together and make friendships across the age groups. Older children demonstrate caring attitudes towards younger children and are positive role models.
- Parents report very positively on the quality of the club. They feel their children enjoy their time at the club and that staff are friendly and approachable.

It is not yet outstanding because:

 Opportunities for more precise continuous professional development are not always considered to underpin and expand on the good knowledge of staff.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

target appropriate training more precisely to support staff to keep up to date with ongoing changes to current practices.

- The inspector observed a number of children's activities throughout the inspection.
- The inspector sampled some of the documentation available, including safeguarding information.

Inspection findings

Effectiveness of the leadership and management is good

Safeguarding is effective. Staff implement the policies and procedures well and conduct thorough risk assessments, prioritising children's safety in all areas, both inside and outside. Staff monitor children's safety extremely well and use clear explanations to help ensure that they learn to understand potential hazards. Staff are also aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and know what action to take should they have any concerns about a child's welfare. The manager works closely with staff to promote their professional development effectively. They strive to improve their knowledge through accessing relevant training. Staff foster good links with the host school and information is shared well to ensure continuity of care.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Children arrive happily and enjoy their time at the club. Staff introduce some planned activities to offer variety, including art and craft. Children have daily opportunities to be active indoors and outdoors. Outside, children enjoy playing group games, such as football. They work together and celebrate as a team when they score a goal. Children enjoy socialising with others. They develop positive relationships with everyone at the club and settle well. Children express their views and say they like coming to the club. They enjoy the activities and playing with friends. Staff are friendly and join in when needed while allowing children to lead their own play. Children in the early years age group are well supported by staff. They relax or are active according to their needs. Throughout the session, children engage in conversation with staff, using and developing their communication skills effectively. Staff play alongside children and chat to them about significant events in their lives, for example, recent birthday celebrations. As a result, staff know each child well.

Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Children relate well to staff who have a clear understanding of their individual care needs. Staff members are well deployed to provide good levels of supervision for all children to keep them safe. Children quickly settle into the routines of the club. They behave well, are polite and respect the rules of the setting because staff make these clear. Staff value children's views and opinions, building their confidence and self-respect. During snack time, children sit together, chatting to each other and to staff. Children are encouraged to follow good hygiene routines. They have a good understanding of keeping healthy and safe. They respond well to staff's expectations of appropriate behaviour. Staff understand the need to protect children and ensure they play in a safe and secure environment.

Chillout Kids Club was registered in 2014. The club employs four members of childcare staff. Of these, two hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3. The club opens Monday to Friday during term time. Sessions are from 3pm until 6pm. The club operates a holiday club Monday to Friday during the school holidays. Sessions are from 8am until 6pm.
