Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how children learn at various ages and stages of their development. She has procedures to observe, assess and monitor their progress to help prepare children for school. The childminder would work in partnership with parents and other early years professionals to help support children's individual learning needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with a healthy diet and knows the procedures to follow to prepare food hygienically. She plans to promote opportunities for children to have a healthy lifestyle, such as with exercise in the fresh air.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children's welfare and knows how to identify and report any concerns to their safety.
- The childminder plans to take account of the views of parents and children to evaluate the quality of her provision and to plan for improvements. She updates herself with training to improve her knowledge and skills continually.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that the childminder intends to use for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector looked at documentation, and a selection of policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed self-evaluation and the childminder's partnership with other early years professionals.
